Environmental Studies: Mr. Bryan Hunter



Foundation, Year 1 and 2 students discovered many wonders in the garden when they planted many seeds including potatoes. They pulled weeds to make weed mountains and created 'no dig' gardens by using multiple layers of organic materials. The highlight for many students was feeding some of the weeds they pulled from the garden to the chickens, ducks and rabbits.

Year 3 and 4 students learnt how energy is produced with the use of fossil fuels and now with more renewable energies such as wind, water and sun. They delved deeper into wind power where

they researched, designed and built their own wind turbines that proved to be hit and miss for some students depending on their design.

Year 5 and 6 students discovered what climate change is and made decisions about whether they believed humans have made it worse or whether it is just a natural occurrence. After learning many interesting facts on climate change, students wrote a narrative titled 'MY 2050' where they described what the world would be like in 30 years, depending on what climate change will do.

For Foundation and Year 1 and 2 students, simple games are important opportunities to form critical skills. One example is a game called 'Horse and Rider.' Children form pairs and one child becomes the horse and the other, the rider. They start together but then the horse 'escapes' and the rider chases, catches and returns their 'naughty horse' to the stable. The explicit focus is to experiment with dodging skills such as zigzagging and changing speed to avoid capture. These are critical skills used in many sports. After the chase, children reflected on how they dodged and how they could improve their dodging for other games and sports.

Year 3 and 4 students experimented with invasion game skills such as 'give and go' (pass and run). These skills were applied in mini games of basketball, which mimics how the strategies are used in real sports.

Year 5 and 6 students undertook various general all round fitness tests on such things as strength and balance. The groups reflected on how the aspects of fitness apply to daily life and why they are important. The results were recorded in Seesaw and the tests will be repeated in Term 4 so that the children can identify their progress.

Students celebrated Mother's Day with cards and video messages and also learnt about the Dragon Boat Festival with its history, cultural food and boat racing.

Foundation students learnt to sing the song '这是我的家人' about different members of a family along with actions to match the meaning of each family member.

Year 1/2 students learnt how to introduce their family and express love for different members of their family.

In Year 3 and 4 students learnt to type using a pin yin keyboard and made sentences about what they do at scheduled times of their day. Using this sentence structure they made a digital weekday schedule in Mandarin.

Year 5 and 6 students explored different Chinese foods and learnt to use different ways to describe their favourite Chinese foods. In groups they then collaboratively prepared a script to act out a role play of a customer ordering food.
