Foundation students main focus this term

INQUIRY

Foundation students are learning all about themselves, their cul-Iture and what makes different. families special through the inquiry unit 'Look at Me.

What you can do at home: Talk about:

- What does the flag look like from your family's place of origin?
- What special celebrations and traditions do you share?

MARVELOUS MATHS

Maths is everywhere. Take every opportunity you can *to talk about it... at home, the supermarket, in the kitchen, setting the table. The more you look, the more you find. The Foundation students will be building their number sense through lots of hands on activities which will include recognising and matching numbers, building collections, writing numbers, etc. Students will practise the days of the week each morning while looking at our daily timetable and will be counting each day at school until we get to our 100th day of school, where we will celebrate together! Patterns and sorting will be a big focus! this term and we will be looking for patterns all around us, as well as making our own from shapes, colours and body movement. We want to develop confident little mathematicians who know it is okay to take a risk, while. building solid foundations and a love of numbers and maths!





 Foundation students will be involved in meditation, yoga nected to your child's See Saw and mindfulness throughout the day to give their busy brains a break and to help develop the whole child. Teachers will be introducing strategies to help students build new friendships and students will have the opportunity to practise these through role plays and group activities. We will be learning about different feelings. through the use of 'Kimochis' and ways to manage our own feelings. Interest based play experiences will be set up at different times throughout the week for students to explore their interests, practise and build oral language and communication skills and encourage new friendships and social development.



INDIGENOUS

Foundation students will be learning about Indigenous perspectives

through all areas of learning. We will be discussing and looking at different words and symbols that are associated with indigenous culture through our Science unit 'Weather in our World'. As part of Inquiry we will be looking at traditional celebrations, and what the colours on the flag represent. Traditional stories will be part of our literacy program and students will learn the meaning of our acknowledgment of country.
