Year 3/4 News

In Literacy, Year 3/4 students are learning to understand that readers have personal preferences for specific genres. They are working on finding their IPICK book to help them engage in their reading. They are also learning to express and explain their personal preference for the books they like to read. Students get voice and choice for what they would like to write about. They can decide if they would like to write an Information report, persuasive or narrative text on their choice of topic. Students are learning to work their way through the writer's cycle beginning with generating their ideas. Once they choose their favourite idea they will begin to continue to follow through the writer's cycle. Their teachers are looking forward to seeing some fantastic published texts.

In Integrated Maths, students are learning to ask a question with variables then collect, record and display the data in a variety of ways and make mathematical statements about the data. Students are displaying their data by creating lists, tables, picture graphs and column graphs. Year 3 students will be using equal sharing, repeated subtraction and their knowledge of their multiplication facts to help them solve related division problems. In Year 4 Maths, students are revising how to solve multiplication problems using the box strategy and vertical algorithm. They will be learning efficient mental and written strategies for solving division problems with no remainder. It is important that Year 3 students learn x2, x5, x10 and x3 multiplication facts and Year 4 students learn all the multiplication facts.

In Year 3 Science, students have been learning about forces and motion. They are learning the effects that different-sized forces have on objects. Students played different games and explored the different push and pull that occurred and created an annotated drawing to describe these forces. Year 4 students will be learning about magnets, how they exert a force on certain objects and how that force affects the object. Through hands on activities and a design project, students will gain an understanding of gravity, friction and magnetic forces at work in their everyday lives.



Year 5/6 News

In Maths, the Year 5/6 students have been focusing on solving mathematical problems using division strategies and have begun to compare and order fractions, decimals and percentages. During Integrated Maths, the Year 5 students have been focusing on 2D and 3D shapes and exploring the properties of each type of shape (angles, curves, vertices, sides and faces). The Year 6 students have been focusing on measuring, comparing and calculating elapsed time (seconds, minutes and days). They will also be focusing on chance and probability using fractions, decimals and percentages.

This term in Literacy, students have been developing their inferencing strategies to gain a further understanding of texts and images. During writing sessions, the students have been exploring different types of information texts, including newspaper articles and letters to the editor and identifying their varying features. They have also been focusing on extending their writing abilities by using complex sentences to make their writing more interesting.

During Science, students have been exploring the properties of liquids, solids and gasses and investigating how they can be altered under different situations. In History, students are learning about early colonial life in Australian history and how Australia has changed over time.

In other news, St John's Ambulance trainers visited our Year 5/6 students to teach them First Aid and CPR. It provided a practical CPR component, guiding students through how to perform CPR and when it is required in a First Aid situation. Students also participated in group problem-solving scenarios based on a variety of first aid situations, allowing them to apply their knowledge.

Yogi Update

Yogi has done such a fantastic job settling back into the school routine. He is finally in the learning spaces with students. All students are doing such a good job remembering the 3 expectations:

- 1. We say hello to the person, not the dog!
- 2. We give lots of space when we pass the dog!
- 3. We keep moving (we don't stand around and stare). This has helped Yogi to relax because we have learnt that a happy dog is a relaxed dog.

Yogi has started working with the Year 1/2, 3/4 and 5/6 students. He will be working with the Foundation students within the next two weeks. Some students are learning how to correctly handle and care for a dog. This includes making sure he has access to food and water, taking him out on toilet breaks, playing fetch and giving him lots of cuddles. Students will be taught how to control Yogi correctly when on the lead and help to reinforce tricks he has learnt like stay, sit and down.

Yogi is still learning that things will be okay without his mum (Miss Walton) as he misses her when she isn't arou
