YEAR 3/4

In Reading we are learning how to be a connector, a summariser and a vocabulary enricher to help us understand the text more. We are learning how to have good discussions in small groups about our book club book or our IPick book. In Writing we have been working our way through the writer's cycle. In the writer's cycle we do seed planting, planning, drafting, revising, editing, publishing and reflecting. When we get to the publishing stage, we get to publish however we like! – Sahara Year 3

In Literacy we have been learning about poetry. I enjoyed learning about figurative language because it makes your writing more fun to read and makes the reader hooked into the book or writing piece. I loved writing haiku poems because it was about seasons and my favourite season is summer. Diamante poems are fun because you can create a synonym poem or an antonym poem. I enjoyed analysing poems because it helped me understand what the poem is about and what it means. Poetry is a lot of fun and some poems make me laugh. – Alex Year 4

In Maths we are learning about fractions of a collection, a fraction of a collection is when you have a group of something and you divide it into equal groups. My favourite part about learning this topic was the fun games I did in my maths group about fractions. We are learning lots about halves, thirds, quarters, eighths and twelfths. We are also learning about simple equivalent fractions. – *Vy Year 3*

In Integrated Maths we are learning about 2D shapes and 3D objects. We have been learning different kinds of shapes, their names and features. For example, we have been counting how many corners, edges and faces 3D objects have. We have also been learning about nets. Nets are used to describe what a 3D shape would look like if it was opened out and laid flat. We have been learning how to find the area of regular and irregular 2D shapes. I love learning about shapes. My favourite shape is a cube because I enjoy drawing it! – *Natalie Year 4*



In Inquiry we are learning how to create a stop motion animation. We need to plan our setting, props and characters using our project booklets. We are about to bring in toys that have movable limbs, such as barbie dolls, Lego, Duplo or anything that moves its arms and legs. Then we will take lots of photos and put it together to make it look like our characters are moving. My favourite thing about this activity is that we get to learn new things and at the same time have fun and we get to communicate more with our friends. *Derek Year 4*



FOUNDATION NEWS

On Wednesday, 19th October, the Foundation students and staff embarked on an adventure to CERES in Brunswick East. The bus ride was very exciting and once we arrived, we were greeted by the CERES staff. We were fortunate to have perfect weather to explore our surrounds. APRS students are so lucky to have prior knowledge about this due to exposure through Mr. Hunter's environmental program. At CERES, students discovered what an 'urban farm' means and how it can benefit the community.

They had the opportunity to get up close and feed chickens which caused great excitement as the chickens were very hungry, even pecking at our legs! We learnt about plant lifecycles and how to grow and care for a seed when we planted marigold or silver beet seeds. Another highlight was learning about worms and their role in creating healthy soil. Did you know that a worm has 5 hearts! The bus ride was a lot quieter on the way home with many students looking at the back of their eyelids, enjoying a nap. All around, it was a wonderful experience for our ARPS students.

YOGI UPDATE



Yogi was ecstatic to be back at school to see all the students, teachers and staff. Over the school holidays, he enjoyed lots of walks through parks, dog parks and ovals where he can be off the lead. He has come back to school taller, heavier and with less fur as he had a fancy new haircut.

This term, Miss Walton is training Yogi to wear a halti which is a collar that goes over his snout and around the back of his head. A halti stops dogs from pulling on the lead which will help when students want to walk Yogi. You might see Yogi around the school with this harness on. He doesn't like the harness as he is still getting used to it. It doesn't hurt him, he just doesn't find it comfortable.

The teachers have been trying new timetables that suit both Yogi and the school. Yogi is currently spending a full day in each learning space. On Mondays he is with the 5/6s, Tuesday he is with the 1/2s, Thursdays he is in Foundation and Fridays he is in the 3/4 learning space. On Wednesday he has a day off, as he is still a puppy and needs a day to rest and recover.

There are a group of 9 staff members who are a part of the Dogs Connect program who are learning more about how to incorporate a wellbeing dog into a school community. The core team of teachers have regular meetings where they discuss how things are going and what could be changed to make this program run better.

On Friday, 21st October, Yogi attended the Year 3 sleepover. He joined in group games and activities and was spoilt with lots of cuddles from students while they were watching their chosen movie. He was well behaved at night and helped make the Year 3 students comfortable for their night away from home.

YEAR 5/6

Maths



A visit from a police officer demonstrating the process of finger printing as part of law enforcement within the community.

During Maths sessions, the Year 5 students have been investigating lines of symmetry in 2D shapes and how rotations and reflections can affect a shape's symmetry. They have also been learning about the Cartesian plane and identifying the features of this type of coordinate system. Students have used specific coordinates to create patterns and words on the plane. Year 6 students have been investigating various types of angles and how degrees of angles can be measured using a protractor. They have been learning about the properties of 3D shapes, identifying angles and features within these shapes. Students have also continued to build their knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages and develop their multiplication facts recall.

Literacy

Students have been studying a variety of authors and their texts - comparing and contrasting writing styles and themes, analysing texts and illustrations and making connections between the author's life and work. Students have also been working on a project where they have been creating and publishing a variety of pieces of writing including diary entries, character profiles and narratives, based on a particular topic. The Year 5 students are completing their projects on a topic of their choice while the Year 6 students are completing their project on their memories of their time at Athol Road Primary School.

Civics and Citizenship

Students have been learning about the values of Australia's democracy and the roles within the government. They have studied the process of elections and how democratic values are reflected in the electoral system. Students have explored the role of Parliament and the specific people who are responsible for enforcing the laws within Australia. As part of studies in law enforcement, the Year 5/6 students had a visit from a police officer who specialised in finger printing. The police officer explained the process of finger printing and completed demonstrations on some of the students.

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)

During SEL, students have been exploring how to maintain a growth mindset both in and out of school. They have learned that having a growth mindset allows them to learn from their mistakes, have a positive attitude, persevere with challenges and give things a go. They have also discussed and identified their strengths, and how they could use these strengths both now and in the future.

LEARN ABOUT AUSTRALIA'S FLORAL EMBLEM

The GOLDEN WATTLE is Australia's floral emblem. Did you know that there are more than 1 000 different species of wattle in Australia. The official name of the wattle is acacia.

The golden wattle is an evergreen shrub or small tree that grows naturally naturally throughout Australia. It is resilient to cope with Australia's droughts, winds and bushfires. Most species of wattle have tough, leaf-like flattened stems instead of leaves. These help the plan to withstand water loss through sun and rain.

Even if the parent plants are destroyed in bushfires, their seeds have a special survival mechanism to ensure new wattle plants grow back after sufficient rain. The wattle's secret for survival is that its seeds have tough coats that open after the heat of fires. Just like Australian people the golden wattle has a great capacity to flourish in the face of adversity.
