All the students managed to squeeze into the front paddock to watch the amazing demonstration of all 3 of our woolly, hairy friends get their first haircut. Danny really explained each part of the process and was happy to answer any questions along the way.

Our sheep were shorn first and their transformation was outstanding. They are now both very pretty girls with their new hair do's. It was strange to see the sheep just lay on their backs, with very little struggling, as Danny moved his clippers across their bodies.

Cruz, the alpaca, was saved for the finale where he needed to be strapped to a table before any shearing could be done.

Danny and his assistants took great care with Cruz and kept him calm throughout the very first shear in his life. He also received his vitamin injections, dental check and had his nails clipped.

Cruz is now looking like a fancy poodle with a bit of fluff up top and bare down below. All three of our animals will now be able to enjoy the warmer weather, going into summer without wearing their winter coats.



YEAR 1/2 LIGHT & SOUND

The Year 1 / 2 students are investigating light and sound in science. Students are exploring the difference between sound and light and where they see light and hear sounds within their lives. Students had to listen and hear sounds, record sounds they heard and imitate sounds.

Students went on a listening walk around the school to hear the different sounds with a checklist to mark when they heard each sound. Sounds they heard included a ball bouncing, coughing, talking, cars and many more. Students then explored the difference between high and low sounds, such as a drum kit versus a flute. Students have loved learning about sound and light and are excited to learn more about light in the upcoming science lessons!

LEARN ABOUT AUSTRALIA'S NATIONAL GEMSTONE THE OPAL

The opal was proclaimed Australia's national gemstone on 23rd July 1993 by His Excellency the Honorable Bill Hayden AC.

Australia's precious opals include:

- Black opal with colors of red, green, blue, violet, magenta or yellow against dark backgrounds of black, dark blue or dark grey. Most of the world's supply of black opals come from Lightning Ridge in NSW.
- White opals which are the most common type of precious opal have vibrant colors with a white or milky background. These gems are found at White Cliffs in NSW and Coober Pedy in SA.
- Crystal opals are transparent and form the bulk of the precious opal supplied to the world from Australia.
- Boulder opals are a kind of white opal found in the veins and cavities in mudstone and sandstone and are found in Queensland.
